



Vision for Knox Community Forums

Thank you to those who attended one of the Vision for Knox Community Forums in September 2020. We appreciate the time and energy given by all who participated. There were some great conversations, lots of suggestions and excellent feedback that will all contribute to the development of our new Community Plan 2021 - 2031.

Below are some of the findings from the forums.

What makes Knox great

There were lots of things people love about Knox and what makes it a great community. The main themes were as follows:

The environment including parks, reserves, bushland and opens spaces.	The sense of connection and the feeling that Knox is a happy, safe, friendly place to live.	The embracing of diversity and sense of belonging.
Good facilities and services including sporting clubs, playgrounds, hospitals and libraries.	Access and being able to get everything you need within Knox.	 Having a voice and the opportunity to have a say.

Vision for Knox

Some of the topics of discussion around what Knox should aim for in the next 10 years included the following:

Recognition of and working in partnership with the traditional land owners.	Embracing diversity (including on Council).	An inclusive community.	Respect for different values and cultures.
Appropriate development, greener and less high rise.	Economic support for local businesses	Sustainability and care for the environment.	Support/accessibility for all ages, abilities, cultural groups, families, and the vulnerable

Feedback on our current Goals

During the forum, we asked participants about the Goals in the current Knox Community and Council Plan 2017-2021.

After viewing some data about each goal, we asked if the goal was still important. Participants were asked to rate the goal from 1 to 5 – where 5 meant that the goal was still very relevant and important, through to 1 which meant it was less relevant and important.

Over the three sessions, this is how the goals were rated on average:

	Goal 1 – We value our natural and built environment	4.8
